7 Days, 8 Nights

The tour starts at London Euston, where we meet at 8pm to catch the sleeper north.

Day One

We take the gondola (cable car) up Aonach Mor for views of the Ben Nevis range and across the Great Glen. Later we visit historic Glen Coe before making for the vibrant port town of Oban for our first night.

Day Two

We catch the ferry across to the Isle of Mull and make for Fionnphort and the passenger ferry to the celebrated island of Iona where we visit the Abbey. We cross to the northwest of Mull for a two night stay in Tobermory.




Day Three Wé go east across Mull to Ulva Ferry, where (sea conditions permitting) we take a boat trip out to the island of Staffa, famed for its basalt rock formations and Fingal's Cave. (On certain departure dates, days two and three

will be reversed)

Day Four

We cross back to the mainland at Kilchoan. We head for Ardnamurchan, the most westerly point on the island of Great Britain, before visiting Glenfinnan. Glenfinnan has long been famous for the world's first concrete structure the Glenfinnan Viaduct, now even more famous due to its associations with Harry



Day Five

Our final ferry ride takes us onto the isle of

Skye. We spend the day traversing this island, visiting the Talisker whisky distillery and Dunvegan castle. We spend the



night by the Skye Bridge.

Glen Garry to the Glengarry Castle hotel. Here we relax with afternoon tea and enjoy strolling by the side of Loch Oich in the Great Glen.

Day Seven

We travel along the Great Glen, crossing the Caledonian Canal as we do. We stop by the Commando Memorial at Spean Bridge before arriving in Fort William in the early afternoon. Our train back to London departs in the early evening.

The tour starts at London Euston, where we meet at 8pm to catch the sleeper north.

Day One

A fairly long drive to start us off, as we head north from Inverness into the wilderness of the North Highlands. We make several stops, including at the Falls of Shin en route to our hotel for two nights.

Day Two

We tour the far north-east today, crossing the

'Flow Country' and visiting John O'Groats with its nearby sea-stacks and views to Orkney. In season we visit the Castle of Mey.



Day Three

We make our way west along the North Coast towards Durness, a coastland famed for its sandy beaches.

catch the

to the remote Cape Wrath lighthouse. We continue south, passing the famed peaks of Suilven, Foinaven and Arkle to reach our hotel for the night

Day Four
An enjoyable

to the foot of the
UK's highest
waterfall: Eas a'



Chual Aluinn. We reach Ullapool for our overnight stay, with time to explore this port on Loch Broom.

Day Five

The National Trust provide our venues for today, starting at Corrieshalloch Gorge and then visiting the sub-tropical gardens at Inverewe.

We spend the night near Loch Maree.

Day Six

We make a long sweep around Wester Ross, through the Torridon region and climbing over the hair-raising and infamous Bealach na Ba to



reach the remote Applecross. We reach our hotel late in the day for a two night stay in Glen Sheen

Day Seven

Today is a free day, perhaps resting in the hotel or taking a short walk nearby. An alternative is to catch a train from the local station to Kyle of Lochalsh, where there are boat trips or a walk or bus ride over the Skye Bridge on to the Isle of Skye. Or get off the train at Plockton, the pretty waterside village made famous by the Hamish MacBeth television series.

Day Eight We

We make for Loch Ness, and join a cruise along it to



Urquhart Castle.

Our trip ends back in Inverness, with time to explore or shop for Scottish souvenirs. We catch the sleeper in the early evening and dream our way home.

Day One



There are various attractions in the Aviemore area to choose between. The Reindeer

Centre, perhaps, a walk around Loch Eileann (the lake with the island castle), or one of the various sporting attractions. Whatever else you choose, the day will include a trip up the funicular to the summit of the Cairngorm.

Day Two


Wé leave Aviemore to drive down the eastern side of the Cairngorm massif. We visit Glenlivet Distillery and Corgarff castle, originally a home but used as a barracks during the Jacobite rebellion. We end the day on

Royal Deeside, at Ballater.

Mile, you will have time free in the Scottish Capital before catching the train back to Perth.

Day Five West into the Trossachs, eventually making for Loch Katrine and a cruise aboard the steamer Sir Walter Scott. Our tour of the region concludes at our hotel for the evening.

Day Six
We drive north again, and visit the famous Dochart Falls at Killin. We then continue along the shores of Loch Tay and head for



of time to explore this delightful resort, our home for the night.

Day Seven

We make for Blair Castle and will have a Landrover tour of the estate and a high tea together before journeying back to Aviemore and our train home.

Day Three

From May to mid-July we visit Balmoral Castle. When this is closed we make instead for either Braemar Castle or Scone Palace. Our drive

through Glen Shee includes a cafe stop at the summit of the road at Glenshee ski centre. We check in to our hotel in Perth for a two night stay.

Day Four

Today we catch the train to Edinburgh, crossing the Forth Rail Bridge en route. After a visit to the castle and Royal



The prices quoted make use of comfortable hotels with bed & breakfast for around £70-£95 per person per night. The actual hotels to be used will depend on availability on the dates you wish to travel and will be suggested for your approval before booking.

All prices quoted include Breakfast but no other meals (except where mentioned).

If you would prefer to use private B&B accommodation this can be arranged (though note you can pay over £50 for a non-ensuite B&B in many areas of Scotland).

Of course, you could also bring your own tent to make the price a lot cheaper! The holiday will be built around your wishes, requirements and budget.

Travel from London is on the Caledonian Sleeper. Standard Class berths are in cabins for two people, if you are booking on to one of these tours as a single person the Rail Company would allocated you a berth with someone of the same sex. Couples/friends/etc will share a cabin.

First class berths are in private single cabins.

If you hold a National Railcard then the quoted price of the holiday would be reduced. Also, members of the National Trust or English Heritage may be able to make slight reductions in the overall costs quoted for the trips.

The vehicle used on the trip will be a hire car large enough to give ample room to the people in the group, for example a 6 person tour would be in a 9 seater car, or 2 people in a 5 seater.
